Deborah I. Schroeder, Attorney at Law

Deborah I. Schroeder was born in New Orleans, Louisiana. She received a Bachelor's degree in Science and Medical Technology from the University of New Orleans and Louisiana State Medical Center in 1977. She received a law degree in 1982 from Loyola University of the South.

Ms. Schroeder was a member of the Loyola Law Review, 1980-1982. Ms. Schroeder was admitted to the Louisiana Bar in 1982, the Ohio Bar in 1986, and federal bars E.D. Louisiana and M.D. Ohio in 1982 and 1986, respectively.

In 1997 Ms. Schroeder joined the staff counsel office at LAMMICO, now known as Schroeder & Trahan. As staff counsel she has provided defense of medical malpractice suits and claims as well as legal assistance to LAMMICO insureds. Ms. Schroeder's experience includes representation of physician and hospital clients at Lemle and Kelleher, L.L.P., New Orleans, 1991-1996 and 1982-1986. She was a partner in the professional liability, negligence, and insurance defense section of the firm, primarily involved in medical malpractice defense. She also worked in the areas of product liability, general negligence, and insurance defense during her tenure with Lemle and Kelleher. During the intervening years, 1986-1991, Ms. Schroeder represented physicians for Jacobson, Maynard, Tuschman and Kalur, an in-house law firm for a physician mutual insurance company in Ohio. From 1977-1979, she served as a medical technologist in hematology and special procedures for Ochsner Foundation Hospital and Clinic.

Ms. Schroeder is a member of the Louisiana State Bar Association and an inactive member of the Ohio State Bar Association. She belongs to the Defense Research Institute. In 2015 she received the Leadership in Law award from New Orleans City Business.
