Dr. Frederick J. White, III, practices cardiology in Shreveport, Louisiana. He completed his undergraduate degree at Louisiana State University in Shreveport and his MD in 1982 at the LSU Health Sciences Center, Shreveport. He subsequently completed residency training in Internal Medicine at the University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences and fellowship training in cardiology at the Vanderbilt Medical Center, where he served as an Instructor in Medicine and the Chief Fellow in Cardiology. He is certified by the American Board of Internal Medicine in Internal Medicine, Cardiology, and Interventional Cardiology. He is a Fellow of the American College of Cardiology and the American College of Chest Physicians. He is a co-founder of Cardiovascular Consultants, LLP, in Shreveport, where he is a senior partner and member of the Executive Committee.

Dr. White is a member of the medical staff of the Willis Knighton Medical Center where he has held several offices and where he currently serves as Chair of the Institutional Ethics Committee. He holds membership in numerous professional societies and is a Past President of the Shreveport Medical Society. He was a founding director of the Louisiana Chapter of the American College of Cardiology. He represents Louisiana as an Alternate Delegate to the American Medical Association.

Dr. White's strong history of service to LAMMICO started in 1999, when he joined the company's Risk Management Committee. He became a member of the LAMMICO Board of Directors in 2001. He has also served as Senior Vice President of Risk Management and Patient Safety, Chair of the Governance Committee, and as a member of the Executive, Audit and Legislative Activities Committees. Currently, Dr. White is the Chairman of LAMMICO's Board of Directors.

As a member of the Louisiana Commission on Medical Professional Liability, Dr. White assisted in the development of the 2003 medical liability reform legislative package. He is the author of several publications and recently co-authored the study entitled "Medical Malpractice Review Panels and Medical Liability System Cost, Timeliness, and Efficiency: A Cross-Sectional Study," published in the *Journal of Empirical Legal Studies*.
